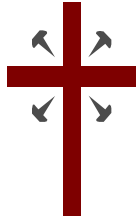
SHROVE TUESDAY PANCAKE SUPPER

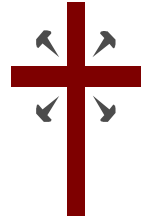

LENT BEGINS FEBRUARY 22



Lent is a time of reflection, quiet prayer, and consideration of how to live God's plan in our lives. It is a time when we look at the past and consider the future. For many of us individually, Lent means subtraction and addition. We try to subtract some of the distractions in our life and we try to

add disciplines that help us become more centered in Christ. If you are in need of assistance in preparing a Lenten discipline, please speak with one of the clergy.



Ash Wednesday Services 10am & 7pm February 22

At 10:00 am and 7:00 pm on there will be Holy Eucharist and the imposition of Ashes, special music of the season, and a sermon. Childcare will be offered at both services. Begin your Lenten journey and commit yourself to a holy and reflective Lent.

Lenten Quiet Day

Join Mary Sicilia for a Quiet Day on Saturday, February 25, from 10:00 am to 2:30 pm. Take some time away before Lent begins to explore the meaning of the cross or, as it turns out, various crosses which different Christian communities have created over time as the central symbol of the faith. There will be time for meditation, conversation, quiet reflection, and worship. Bring a sack lunch - coffee will be provided.

Thursday Light in Lent

Thursday Light is a time of worship, fellowship, and learning. Each evening starts with Eucharist at 5:30, 6:00 soup supper, and 6:45-8:15 class. You are welcome to come for one or all parts of the evening. Classes begin on March 1, and run for 5 weeks. Mary Sicilia will be offering a Lenten Bible Study on "*The Acts of the Apostles: From Jerusalem to the Ends of the Earth*," presenting and discussing the history and development of the earliest Church glimpsed through the book of Acts. Rev. Shelly Fayette and Aaron Scott will be teaching a class on poverty, justice and the Bible; investigating what our Scriptures and faith ask of us in relationship to each other. **Please join us!** Sign up on the sheet in the entryway. Childcare and supper for this event are available with advance registration. Please reserve childcare each week using the sign-up sheet located in the front entry of the church by noon the Tuesday prior to the Thursday date.

Good Shepherd has been a continuous W.H.O. partner from the beginning, in 2003. We are delighted to announce that this is our 10th year with the program. With that said, they have been challenged with many capacity bed nights in previous years. Capacity was raised to 50 guests during the 2009-10 season. There also has been a steady increase of guests with children in recent years. The consistent high number of guests compels a need for maximum volunteer support, especially shifts with meals, chore duties, guest social time and bed assignment or storage. **It will be extremely important that both the evening 6-10PM and 6-9AM morning shifts are fully staffed with 5 volunteers each.** We intend to have a set-up and lead volunteer shift beginning at 5:30PM and 5:30AM respectively. These volunteers should have extensive evening or morning shift experience, and should be very familiar with the responsibilities. Additionally, we have added a nightly transition shift, 9:30PM-1:30AM. This additional volunteer will arrive in time to review prior shift information and be present during the lunch making and laundering of towels. The volunteer staffing schedule for the W.H.O. shifts will be posted in the church entry. We will also have an opportunity to manage the primary W.H.O. food needs with donations. We will have the sign-up sheets for required food items displayed in the entryway during Sundays up until March. Last year it was very successful and saved the Outreach budget significant financial resources.

There are two age groups with different times to attend. If a family has children in more than one age group there will be supplies available to make Easter cards, or they can help plant flowers in the church courtyard.

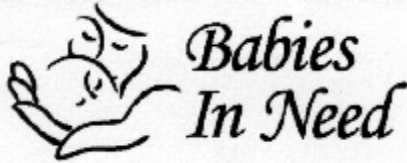

More great news: we received a grant for \$6,768 from the Legacy Qwest Family & Work Development Fund! It is for car seats and portable folding cribs (with a changing table area). The cribs are a new program that we've looked forward to starting when we had both space and funding. Thank you, Lord! And thanks to Don and Jayne Knoop. Jayne is on our board of directors and Don works for Century Link (formerly Qwest). Social Workers at the hospitals and case workers at all the shelters will identify the families that need them and give them vouchers to bring to us.

Currently we are assisting a family fostering newborn triplet boys! Connie Christopher is coordinating efforts towards supporting this family and their needs. Some of those are:

- Prayer - for the babies, siblings, and parents.
 - Childcare assistance: feeding and loving, whatever hours you can give daily or weekly. Great for grandparents whose little ones are far away, or anyone who loves time with infants.
 - Meals for family
 - Laundry - Connie will do several times a week.
 - Rides to the doctor for baby appointments, etc.
 - Diapers - a month at a time.
 - o First month - Babies In Need
 - o Second month - Assorted gifts on hand
 - o Third month - Mothers of Twins group
 - o Remaining months open. Probably best not to buy until we see what size they need then.
- Shopping for basic infant and household needs.

We can't set up a bank account for them because it would jeopardize DSHS support, so Connie has agreed to receive any monetary gifts you want to send and do the shopping.

In-kind gifts - please give to Connie if you live near Amboy, or to Kitty if you are nearer All Saints Church in Hazel Dell. They can be put in the Babies In Need donation box marked, "triplets". (We've just received 3 nice sets of used sheets and 3 sets of towels, a pillow and a lovely spread & shams with pillows.) Mom wears size 14 and Connie knows what she has, needs, and preferences.

Newborns In Need. A Camas sewing/crafts/piano teacher wants to start Newborns In Need groups in WA state. It is a good, national organization that does the same thing that Babies In Need does. They currently have no chapters in WA or OR. I invited her to see our new building and learn about our ministry. In Clark County, she will form sewing groups to make tiny clothes and blankets for 1 to 4 pound live and stillborn preemies and supply those to the NICU's for the babies and the demise kits. She will organize groups like ours in other parts of the state. Babies In Need will continue with our programs to serve newborns from 4 pounds on up who are able to be discharged.

"The Power of One," a series of films depicting real individuals and their responses to the challenges and abuses of some of the great institutions of our time: media, health care, business corporations, and government.



Adults and older teens are invited to join us at 6:30 p.m. on the specified Sunday evenings in the Youth Building.

February 12: *The Insider* shows the contrast between knowing the truth and telling it. Dr. Jeffrey Wigand (a remarkable performance by Russell Crowe) knows the truth about smoking and its links to cancer. When he is challenged by Lowell Bergman (played by Al Pacino) of CBS' 60 Minutes to speak publically he is conflicted and fearful. And rightfully so.

February 26: *The Informant* provides a bit of comic relief to the whistle blower role. Matt Damon as Mark Whitacre is full of insider knowledge and willing to share – at least some of it.

March 11: *Something the Lord Made* moves us into the world of medical research and tells another true story – this time of the costs of racism, not only to the individual but to an entire country. Mos Def and Alan Rickman star in a film that manages to make scientific investigation exciting and the cost of racism, real.

March 25: *George Wallace* deals with one of the most reviled and feared politicians of his time. Entrenched segregation found its champion in George Wallace (Gary Sinise in the role that made him a star). When he was paralyzed from the waist down by an assassin's bullets, he is forced to confront his own sin and culpability. And amazing results follow

April 22 and April 29: *Malcolm X* is Spike Lee's film version of "The Autobiography of Malcolm X" as told to Alex Haley. This film brought the incredible talents of Denzel Washington to the screen with his vigorous portrayal of one of the central figure in the Civil Rights struggle of the 50's and 60's. Again, a life that ends in a totally unexpected but spirit-filled way.
