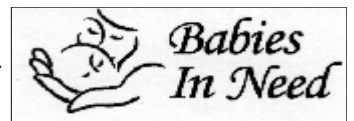

## THE BACK PAGE

### A Junkyard Angel



Evidence of divine presence occurs in the most unlikely places. While dealing with Mom's declining health and uncertainty of restorative treatment, the need for a car repair provided an opening for a touch of love and grace. Several days previous, Dad's car window had fallen into the door and obviously needed to be fixed. This seemed to be just one more difficulty within several very trying weeks.

My Dad, who has always been a wise steward of resources and a fix-it man, dismantled the door to analyze the source of the problem. He determined that the repair could be made with the replacement of a part. So leaving Mom in the care of my sister, he headed to the junkyard in search of a '91 Toyota Camry door.

As "God-incidence" (there are no coincidences) would have it, the appropriate door was found and the needed replacement part was removed. The price was \$30. During a previous discussion amongst us sisters, we anticipated the possibly of the window needing a "shop-repair" which might cost several hundred dollars, so this modest expense – if this indeed solved the problem – was an answer to prayer... but there was more to come! The junkyard attendant offered to install the part for my Dad – for free! – to make sure that it worked. And of course, it did!

Minutes later Dad returned home with yet another reminder of God's presence in even the ordinary events of our lives, especially at times we need a touch the most. I wonder if the junkyard attendant realized his role as a messenger of God's love and grace... And I also wonder how God might use me in the lives of those around me. May my heart be open to others and may I have courage to share my life, resources, grace and love that God has freely shared with me.

## ***An Invitation to Experience Epiphany - The Season of Surprise***



Throughout the fall, the Good Shepherd community has engaged in conversation about “Our Common Spiritual Life.” Our discussions have focused on 5 core elements of that life together, and how we experience them on Sunday and beyond. We are grateful to all who have participated in these rich conversations.

The vestry carefully read and collated all of the information we received through this process, and worked with Rev. Janet Campbell, Diocesan Canon for Liturgy, to form 2 alternative designs to try during Epiphany, the season of surprise. Designs are intended to maximize Good Shepherd’s experience of 5 core elements: worship, fellowship, connection, service, and formation. They offer approaches that contrast with one another and our current design. Following the lab time, we will return to our existing worship schedule and reflect on the alternative designs during Lent. During the Lenten season, the vestry will offer various ways for congregation members to share their responses to the 2 designs.

The designs will feel new and different. That is the intent of the lab time. As you review them, you may feel excitement, uncertainty, even fear about how they will affect your Sunday experience. We invite you to step into this lab time with an open mind and heart and a sense of adventure as we continue to discern together how to best enhance our Sunday experience.
